Update

Dear Resident

I hope this finds you well.

I wanted to write to you to give you a further update on the Neart na Gaoithe (NnG) Offshore Wind Farm. As you know, NnG construction started in May 2020 following a short pause due to the COVID-19 pandemic and works have been ongoing both onshore and offshore since.

The installation of the two underground cables between Thorntonloch Beach and our substation site in the Lammermuir Hills has been completed, as has the horizontal directional drill underneath the beach. Works to construct a new substation at Crystal Rig II Onshore Wind Farm to connect NnG to the National Grid are close to completion, this leaflet provides further information about what to expect over the coming months.

Elsewhere on the project, earlier this year we completed construction of our Operations and Maintenance base in Eyemouth and have successfully completed installation of our two

offshore substations, and our offshore export cables, connecting the wind farm to the onshore export cable at Thorntonloch.

We have recently commenced installation of our inter-array cables offshore, which will connect all the wind turbines to our two offshore substations. On a clear day, you will also be able to see a number of large vessels working on our wind farm site installing foundations and jackets for our wind turbines. The wind turbines themselves are expected to start being installed this summer.

ONSHORE CONSTRUCTION WORKS

A new substation is being built at Crystal Rig II Onshore Wind Farm to connect NnG to the National Grid. The construction works are close to completion and, as such, works will soon commence to reduce and remove materials, welfare and other temporary facilities from the site. This process is expected to be completed by October.

The public road improvements, including junction widening and passing places, will remain in place during the demobilisation period. NnG is liaising with East Lothian Council regarding reinstatement of the widening and passing places and the scope of permanent repairs to the road following completion of construction.

Road closures will be required to support these works, information on these closures will be provided in separate leaflets at the time.

CONCERNS

We have taken on board concerns of the local community, most recently raised at the East Lammermuir Community Council meeting, regarding construction traffic, and are working with our contractor to identify mechanisms to better manage our impact on residents. However, if you do have any concerns, or wish to raise a complaint, let us know.

STANDARD WORKING HOURS

Standard working hours on site are from 07.00 to 19.00 seven days a week. Some quiet works are undertaken overnight. However, there are no HGV (Heavy Goods Vehicle) movements allowed between 19.00 and 07.00.

During this time, you will notice an increase in site traffic, including stone removal convoys on our access route indicated on the map below.

We will continue to use our park and ride and storage facility at 'The Ark' in Dunbar. Buses will transport workers to and from the site in the morning and evening to reduce traffic coming to site. Times will be dependent on activity at site and daylight, but buses are currently leaving Dunbar at 06.45 / 07.00 and returning between 16.00 and 19.00.
